DIRECTIONS FROM THE EAST OR NORTH

From the M5 Junction 31 follow signs onto the A30 West, clearly signed to Okehampton/Bodmin. Continue along the dual carriageway to the exit sign-posted Okehampton (B3260), then exit the A30. At the end of the slip-road (with the BP garage on your left), turn right and drive down the hill into Okehampton. In the middle of the town you will come to traffic lights opposite the White Hart pub (on the far left). Go straight on at these lights and after one mile, at the top of the hill, turn right (sign-posted Northlew). Continue along this road for half a mile and take the right turn sign-posted Northlew. Continue on this road for 0.3 miles, then go straight on at the Hilltown Cross crossroads. The Grange EC is 1.5 miles further along this road, on the left.

DIRECTIONS FROM THE WEST OR SOUTH

Exit the A30 at Sourton Cross (A386 sign-posted Tavistock/Bideford) following signs to Bideford. Go past the Shell filling station and the Little Chef restaurant on your left, and follow the road for 2.1 miles until you come to a mini-roundabout (Fowley Cross). Turn right, following signs to Bideford. After 0.4 miles turn left at the mini-roundabout (sign-posted to Northlew). After a further 0.2 miles take the second left, sign-posted to Northlew. The Grange EC is 1.5 miles along this road, on the left.

Mountain and Moorland Qualifying Rounds:

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part bred are not eligible.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by Full Standard or Life NPS members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 1st – 3rd August 2012.

The highest placed pony owned by an NPS member in each class will qualify for the final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line which is owned by an NPS member and has not already qualified receives the qualification. Qualification may go no lower than 3rd place. Judges and/or stewards are requested to check membership cards prior to presenting the qualifying rosettes and cards. NPS Standard members will be required to upgrade to Full members to enter the final.

NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show.

NPS Show Pony and Show Hunter Pony Qualifying Rounds:

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register or Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB, the GSB, the AHSB, the AASB or in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part-Breds are not eligible unless entered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register or Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB. Ponies must be plaited. Qualifying rounds are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 1st – 3rd August 2012.

The highest placed pony owned by an NPS Full Standard or Life member in each class will qualify for the final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line which is owned by an NPS member, and has not already qualified, receives the qualification.

Qualification may go no lower than 3rd place. Judges and/or stewards are requested to check membership cards prior to presenting the qualifying rosettes and cards. NPS Standard members will be required to upgrade to Full members to enter the final.

NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships:

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Full Standard or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card.

If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve. Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championship

A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by The National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by a Full Standard or Life NPS member in the Mountain & Moorland In-Hand Section. The Sponsor's Rosette is also awarded to the pony receiving the Qualification Card. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 1st – 3rd August 2012.

NPS /FODDER SOLUTIONS BRITISH ISLES AREA IN - HAND CHAMPIONSHIP

The winning pony from each of the in hand classes held at the show is eligible to go forward to this championship. There are no specific registration criteria for ponies. The owner need not be an NPS member for the pony/horse to enter this competition or to qualify for the final but will have to become a Full or Life member to enter the final. The Supreme Champion and Reserve Supreme Champion ponies at each NPS Area show qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship show. If the Supreme and/or Reserve Supreme has already qualified then the qualification may go to the third place, but no lower.

THE NPS /PICTON MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND NOVICE RIDDEN CHAMPIONSHIP

Open to pure bred registered M&M stallions, mares and geldings four years old or over. A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January in the current year, it has done any of the following:

- i) Won an open NPS affiliated mixed M&M Ridden class
- ii) Won a class at an Olympia, HOYS or RIHS qualifying round
- iii) Qualified for HOYS or RIHS Ridden classes
- iv) Qualified for the M&M Novice or Intermediate Ridden final at the NPS Summer Championship show.
- v) Qualified for the M&M Ridden Championship final at Olympia in previous years
Ponies must be shown in a snaffle bit.
- vi) If a pony qualifies for Horse of the Year Show or RIHS in its second year it is immediately de-noviced and cannot compete in the Picton final.

Champion and reserve champions from the following ridden sections are eligible to compete for the Ridden Silver Medal Championship :

- * Peasedown Intermediate Mountain and Moorland Championship
- * Ringside Stud Open Ridden Mountain and Moorland Championship
- * Dargavel Young Open Ridden Pony Mountain and Moorland Championship
- * Picton Novice Ridden Mountain and Moorland Championship
- * Horsequest Grand Prix Ridden Mountain and Moorland Championship

British Isles SUPREME RIDDEN
CHAMPIONSHIP

All Ridden Champions and Reserve Champions to compete

Judges: Both Judges

The winning pony / horse from each of the ridden classes or championships (excluding Leading Rein and First Ridden classes) held at the show is eligible to go forward to this championship. There are no specific registration criteria for ponies. The owner need not be an NPS member for the pony/horse to enter this competition or to qualify for the final but will have to become a Showing member to enter the final. The Supreme Champion and Reserve Supreme Champion ponies at each NPS Area show qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship show. If the Supreme and/or Reserve Supreme has already qualified then the qualification may go to the third place, but no lower qualification may go to the third place, but no lower.

RULES AND CONDITIONS

1. The organizers and each of the show's officers, servants or agents shall not be in any way responsible or accountable for any loss, injury or damage that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatsoever) to exhibitors or their servants or agents or other members of the public, to any animal or property, or to any vehicle brought onto the showground, or on premises used in conjunction with the show, or while entering or leaving, or for anything else in conjunction with, or arising out of, or attributable to the show.
2. This show is run under the showing and competition rules of the National Pony Society (NPS).
3. In all classes the judge's decision is final.
4. Qualifying rounds are open to both NPS Members and Non Members BUT ONLY the highest placed NPS ADULT MEMBER (standard or showing), on production of their membership card in the ring, will be eligible to qualify for the Final. A valid membership card must be in the rider/handler's possession on entering the ring. NPS Adult/Standard members will be required to upgrade to Adult/Showing to enter the Final. Qualification to go no lower than third place.
5. Any person wishing to lodge a protest having reference to any persons or exhibit, shall do so in writing within 30 minutes of the completion of the class and at the same time shall deposit a sum of £10. If the investigation by the committee shows the protest is not sustained, the deposit shall be forfeited to the funds of the show. The committee's decision will be final.
6. All Mountain and Moorland ponies must be registered with their respective breed society and be shown in accordance with their individual society rules.
7. The organisers reserve the right to amend the judges' panel and order of classes if it should become necessary.
8. The committee cannot be held responsible for the clashing of classes – competitors should bear this in mind when making their entries. No entry fees will be refunded.
9. The committee reserves the right to amalgamate classes if deemed necessary.
10. The committee reserves the right to refuse entries without giving a reason.
11. The committee reserves the right to retain all or part of the entry fees in the event of the show being cancelled.
12. Stallions and colts. In hand classes: handlers must have attained their 14th birthday before the 1st of January in the current year. Ridden small breeds classes: riders must have attained their 11th birthday before the 1st of January in the current year. Ridden large breed classes: riders must have attained their 14th birthday before the 1st of January in the current year.
13. No pony under the age of 4 may compete in any ridden class.
14. Spurs are not allowed in any ridden class.
15. Anyone found mistreating a horse or pony may be asked to leave the showground and be reported to the appropriate body.
16. All dogs must be kept on a lead.
